KENYA AIRWAYS REVIEWS ROUTE NETWORK IN RESPONSE TO SUMMER DEMAND

16th June 2022 – Kenya Airways (KQ) would like to announce the following route network changes for the upcoming summer season;

1. **London, United Kingdom:** Increase from 7 to 8 times weekly over June & July with the addition of an overnight flight from Nairobi to London every Sunday.
2. **Paris, France:** Increase from 5 to 6 times weekly with flights from Nairobi to Paris every night, excluding Saturdays.
3. **Amsterdam, Netherlands:** Increase from 4 to 5 times weekly. Flights will operate on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays.
4. **Accra, Ghana:** Increased from 5 weekly to daily flights. Connecting flights from Accra to Freetown (Sierra Leone) will increase to 4 times a week, while Accra to Monrovia (Liberia) will increase to 3 times a week. The recently announced Kenya Airways- Delta codeshare agreement will support flights to Accra, Freetown and Monrovia, enabling daily connections with Delta Air Lines flights from Accra to New York.

While commenting on the changes, Kenya Airways Chief Commercial and Customer Officer Julius Thairu said that the airline was witnessing a faster return to travel demand as the aviation industry recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic. "The review will increase frequency on select routes and we will adjust as the world continues to open up. With our codeshares with British Airways, Air France- KLM and the recently announced Delta Airlines, our customers can now enjoy greater connectivity to their destinations as they travel for business, leisure or to visit their loved
